● Transportation

We understand that traveling abroad can be both exciting and a bit overwhelming, especially when facing language differences. In China, most airports and train stations provide English sign, which will help guide you to taxi waiting area, shuttle bus areas, and other key locations. If you find that signs are unclear or insufficient, don't hesitate to approach a nearby service desk for assistance—staff are generally helpful and accustomed to assisting international travelers.

● Airport Transportation

- Nanjing Lukou International Airport (NKG)

For guests arriving at Nanjing Lukou International Airport, you may take a taxi or metro to reach Holiday Inn Nanjing Qinhuai South.

The estimated fee for a taxi or DiDi from Nanjing Lukou Airport to the Holiday Inn Nanjing Qinhuai South is between 40 and 70 RMB, with a duration of approximately 25-30 minutes for the 20 km distance, depending on the time of arrival and traffic conditions.

Taking the metro costs approximately 7 RMB. You can first take Metro Line S1 (Airport Line) from Lukou Airport Station to Nanjing South Station, then transfer to Metro Line 3 (direction of Mozhoudonglu) and get off at Mozhoudonglu Station. The entire journey takes about 80 minutes. Exit from Mozhoudonglu Station via Exit 2, and it's about a 2-3 minute walk (approximately 200 meters) to reach the Holiday Inn.

Note: You might need to save in phone or print out the Chinese name of your hotel or other destination, when taking taxi, in case that driver can't understand English. (Such as Holiday Inn Nanjing Qinhuai South in Chinese: 南京上秦淮假日酒店——秣周东路21号.)

- Beijing Capital International Airport (PEK) / Beijing Daxing International Airport (PKX)

For guests arriving in Beijing, you may choose to continue by flight or transfer to a high-speed train to reach Nanjing.

If continuing by flight: Please verify whether your departing flight and your arriving flight operate from the same airport. Note that PEK and PKX are approximately 80 km apart.

If taking the high-speed train: Tickets can be purchased online via the official 12306 platform. It is recommended to book 1 to 2 weeks in advance. You can take a taxi or the metro from the airport to Beijing South Railway Station, then board the high-speed train to Nanjing South Railway Station:

By Taxi:

From PKX to Beijing South Station: 50 km, 1 hour, fare approximately 100–150 RMB.

From PEK to Beijing South Station: 40 km, 1 hour, fare approximately 80–130 RMB.

By Metro:

From PKX to Beijing South Station: Take the Daxing Airport Express → Line 19 → Line 14. Journey time is approximately 50 minutes, fare 38 RMB.

From PEK to Beijing South Station: Take the Capital Airport Express → Line 5 → Line 14. Journey time is approximately 80 minutes, fare 29 RMB.

Upon arrival at Nanjing South Railway Station, you can take Metro Line 3 to reach Mozhoudonglu Station.

- Shanghai Pudong International Airport (PVG) / Shanghai Hongqiao International Airport (SHA)

For guests arriving in Shanghai, you may choose to continue by flight or transfer to a high-speed train to reach Nanjing.

If continuing by flight: Please verify whether your departing flight and your arriving flight operate from the same airport. Note that PVG and SHA are approximately 70 km apart.

If taking the high-speed train: Tickets can be purchased online via the official 12306 platform. It is recommended to book 1 to 2 weeks in advance. You can take a taxi or the metro from the airport to Shanghai Hongqiao Railway Station, then board the high-speed train to Nanjing South Railway Station:

By Taxi:

From PVG to Shanghai Hongqiao Station: 70 km, 70–80 minutes, fare approximately 190–240 RMB.

From SHA to Shanghai Hongqiao Station: 7 km, 15 minutes, fare approximately 20–30 RMB.

By Metro:

From PVG to Shanghai Hongqiao Station: Line 2. Journey time is approximately 90–100 minutes, fare 8 RMB.

From SHA to Shanghai Hongqiao Station: Line 10. Journey time is approximately 5–10 minutes, fare 3 RMB.

Upon arrival at Nanjing South Railway Station, you can take Metro Line 3 to reach Mozhoudonglu Station.

- Guangzhou Baiyun International Airport (CAN)

For guests arriving in Guangzhou, you may choose to continue by flight or transfer to a high-speed train to reach Nanjing.

If continuing by flight: You can take a flight from CAN to Nanjing Lukou International Airport (NKG). The flight duration is approximately 2.5 hours.

If taking the high-speed train: Tickets can be purchased online via the official 12306 platform. It is recommended to book 1 to 2 weeks in advance. You can take a taxi or the metro from the airport to Guangzhou South Station, then board the high-speed train to Nanjing South Railway Station:

By Taxi:

From CAN to Guangzhou South Station: Approximately 55 km, 70 minutes, fare approximately 110–160 RMB.

By Metro:

From CAN to Guangzhou South Station: Line 3 → Line 2. Journey time is approximately 70–80 minutes, fare approximately 9 RMB.

Upon arrival at Nanjing South Railway Station, you can take Metro Line 3 to reach Mozhoudonglu Station.

- Metro

Nanjing is well-known for its mass metro system, taking metro is cost-saving and convenient; you can choose the English menu or ask the metro staff for purchasing the tickets.

- Train

China Railway now provide the online platform 12306, for foreigner to purchase the high-speed train ticket with Passport information, you can start to register or purchase on the 12306 train ticket website two week before arrival.

- Rideshare and Taxi

The common rideshare App used in China is DIDI (滴滴), foreign phone numbers can be used for registration. If you already set up WeChat Pay or Alipay, you can use the DIDI mini app inside them and directly pay, otherwise foreign credit cards are also accepted by the official DIDI app. If necessary, ask hotel front desk people or any passionate people for helping place a taxi order.

AMAP (高德地图) is a map provided by Alibaba Group, and you can also call a car by AMAP. More drivers are using AMAP and it will be cheaper than DIDI in most cases.

● Money Conversion

The official (cash) Currency (货币) of China is the renminbi (人民币, RMB), whose basic unit, Chinese Yuan (international abbreviation CNY), is most well known. Subdivision differs from what some people may be used to in their own country, as both one hundredth of unit (ie.cent), called fen (分), and one tenth of unit, called jiao (角) are commonly used. Coins of a tenth of a yuan are therefore have a big "1" written on them, referring to one jiao.

● Electrical Plug / Outlet

The electric power supply in China is 220V at 50Hz. The standard plug types are Type A, Type I, and Type C, with the most common being the 2-prong round or flat pins and 3-prong grounded plugs. Please prepare a universal converter if the type of plug or power supply is different.

● Telephone / SIM Card

It is highly recommended to purchase the SIM card at airport SIM card counter, since airport counter tend to offer English service. You need to present the passport to purchase SIM card plan.

Currently there are three major Chinese telecommunication companies dominate the mainland China market, China Mobile, China Telecommunication and China Unicom.

● Cultural Consideration

- Social Etiquette

A polite nod or handshake is typical in Chinese professional business settings. It is recommended to download the translation App in case that English conversation with locals is unavailable. Being on time is highly valued in Chinese business culture. It's will be respectful to arrive a few minutes early for meetings, conference sessions, or group activities. Chinese culture emphasizes modesty. As a result, local people may appear a bit reserved at first-this is not a sign of indifference, but rather a form of respect and cultural etiquette.

- Cashless Payments

Mobile payment platforms such as WeChat Pay and Alipay are widely used across Nanjing. While some establishments accept international credit cards, it's advisable to carry some local currency (RMB) or seek assistance with setting up mobile payments for convenience. China don't have the tips culture, it is not required to pay tips in restaurant,bar or hotel housekeeping.

- Dining Culture

China is well-known for its cuisine diversity; almost each province has their own cuisine style and exotic restaurants, such as European, Japanese, Korean, Thai and Indian, are common in Nanjing.

In most Chinese restaurants, hot water or hot tea is served by default, and cold or iced water is rarely available. If you prefer cold drinks, you may request bottled or canned drinks as alternatives. Many modern restaurants now use QR code-based ordering systems or paying the check, so it is highly recommended to download and register WeChat or Alipay in advance. Traditional Chinese cuisine often features rich and flavorful seasonings such as soy sauce, black vinegar, pickled vegetables, chili paste, MSG, and fish sauce. If you have any dietary restrictions or allergies, please inform the restaurant staff in advance. When it comes to seafood, it is common for traditional Chinese restaurants to serve bone-in fish or any shellfish with the shell, as a way to prove its freshness and natural flavor.

侵华日军南京大屠杀遇难同胞纪念馆 The Memorial Hall of the Victims in Nanjing Massacre by Japanese Invaders

As a national first-class museum and a lasting monument to peace, the Memorial Hall stands on the original site where the remains of thousands of massacre victims were discovered. Built in 1985 and expanded to over 103,000 square meters, the hall uses architecture, sculptures, and immersive exhibits to guide visitors through history. Its powerful memorial spaces—from the Statues Square and the "Pit of Ten Thousand Corpses" site to the Cemetery Square and the Peace Park—create a solemn journey of reflection. Through nearly 10,000 historical artifacts,

photographs, and video records, the exhibition "The Historical Facts of the Nanjing Massacre" presents irrefutable evidence, including archives inscribed in the UNESCO Memory of the World Register . Since 2014, it has been the official venue for China's National Memorial Ceremony, conveying a timeless message to the world: remember history, cherish peace . A must-visit for those seeking to understand a defining chapter of World War II and humanity's enduring hope for a peaceful future.

夫子庙-老门东 Confucius Temple & Laomendong Historic Area

As the cultural heart of Nanjing, the Confucius Temple area and Laomendong Historic District together form a captivating journey through the city's rich heritage. The Confucius Temple, originally built in 1034 during the Song Dynasty, honors the great philosopher Confucius and includes the Jiangnan Gongyuan—the largest imperial examination hall in ancient China. Fronting the temple, the Qinhuai River flows gracefully, its banks lined with the longest screen wall in China. Just a 15-minute walk away lies Laomendong, a meticulously restored historic district where traditional Chinese buildings with elegant horse-head walls recreate the authentic atmosphere of old Nanjing. Lively street sculptures depict daily life from centuries past, while at night, the area hosts a stunning 3D architectural projection show on the ancient city walls.

钟山风景区 Zhongshan Mountain National Park

As a national scenic area and the cultural soul of Nanjing, Zhongshan Mountain (also known as Purple Mountain) lies east of the city center. It encompasses three main attractions: Sun Yat-sen's Mausoleum, Ming Xiaoling Mausoleum, and Linggu Temple.

Sun Yat-sen's Mausoleum, built in 1929, honors the founder of modern China. Visitors climb 392 stone steps to reach the memorial hall, with inscriptions reflecting his ideals of universal love and equality.

Ming Xiaoling Mausoleum, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is the tomb of the Hongwu Emperor, founder of the Ming Dynasty. Its winding Sacred Way, lined with stone animals and officials, is a masterpiece of imperial architecture.

Linggu Valley offers a peaceful retreat, featuring the Beamless Hall—a 14th-century structure built entirely of brick without wooden beams.

A must-visit destination where imperial history and modern China rest beneath ancient forests.

玄武湖公园-明城墙 Xuanwu Lake & Ming City Wall

Xuanwu Lake is the largest royal garden lake in China, spanning 472 hectares in central Nanjing. Its five scenic islets, connected by bridges and causeways, offer pavilions, willow trees, and beautiful views of the modern city skyline. Adjacent to the lake stands the Nanjing Ming City Wall, the longest existing city wall in the world. Built from 1366 to 1386, it originally stretched 35.3 kilometers. Walking along the Xuanwu Gate section provides a unique perspective—the ancient lake on one side and the modern skyline on the other. A must-visit destination where 600-year-old history meets natural beauty.

● Shopping Mall
